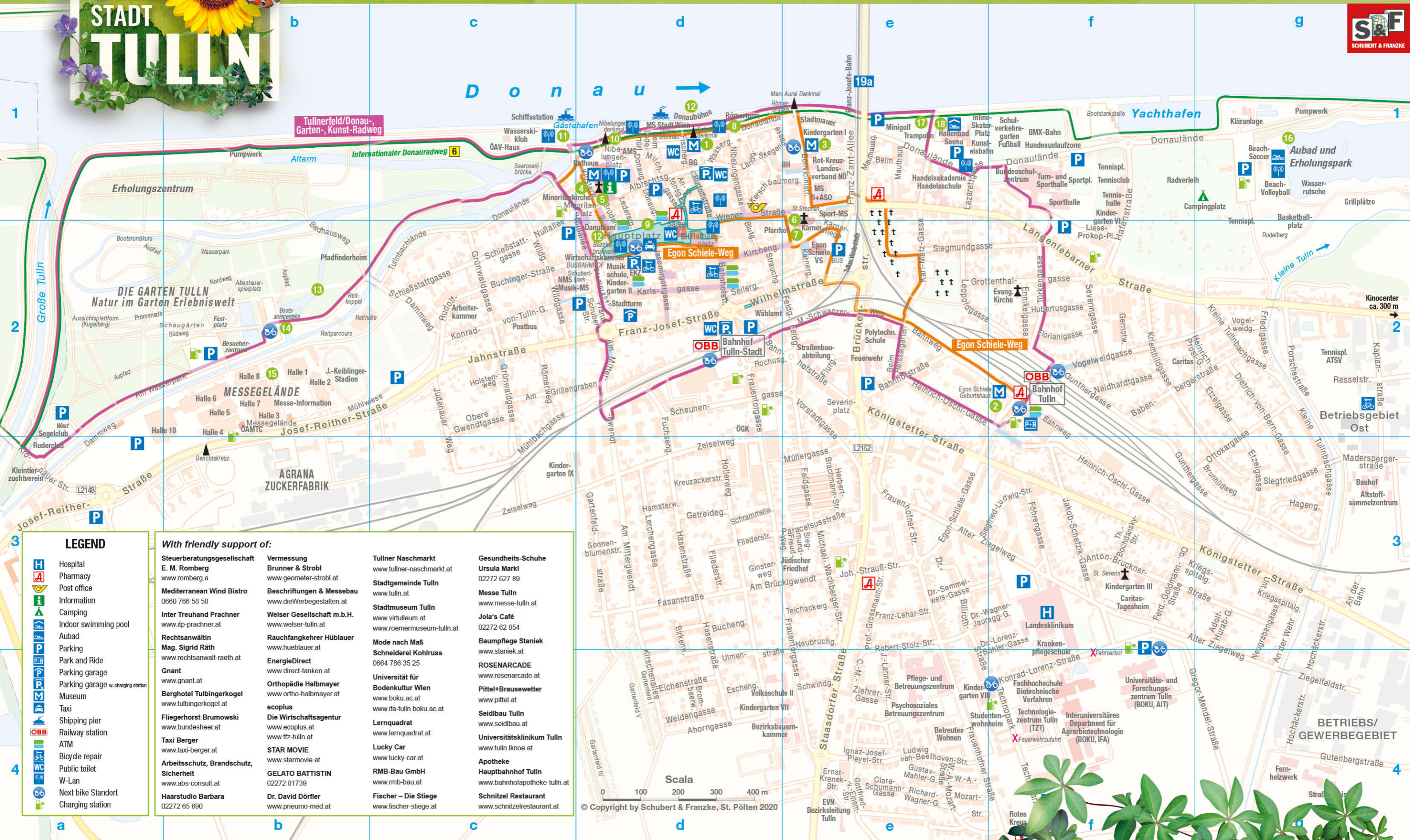

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WELCOME TO TULLN, A CITY OF GARDENS AND ART ON THE DANUBE

Tulln is a district seat in Lower Austria and a center of commerce, culture and recreation with so much to offer. This town on the Danube is interlaced with green spaces, from the Water Park and Donaulände river promenade to the Aubad. That explains its national and international reputation as the premier garden town. Tulln also has close ties with art and culture. Besides being Egon Schiele's hometown, it has a Roman past and is the venue of the big Donaubühne stage. It is likewise a well-known and much-beloved venue for trade fairs.



Great tip for bad weather

Egon Schiele special theme trail: Each of the thirteen stations has modern art objects that symbolize an aspect of Schiele's childhood in Tulln. Schiele's life and times become tangible through lively interactive stories.

Boating at Water Park & Aubad: From May to September, Water Park visitors can rent canoes and pedal boats daily at the GARTEN TULLN landing stage. Open till 11 p.m. on full-moon nights when guests are greeted with a glass of sparkling wine. Rental boats are available at Aubad, too. Information at Tourist Information Office.

NextBike & Tulli Express: Nine NEXTBIKE stations have rental bikes available to cycling enthusiasts 24 hours a day in the warm seasons of the year. The TULLI EXPRESS tourist train runs Sat, Sun and holidays from 2 p.m.-6 p.m. in fair weather. Information at Tourist Information Office.

On **guided town tours** you can see the main sights while enjoying amusing anecdotes. There are regular dates for the town history tour, but you can also book special theme tours, e.g. on Egon Schiele or gardens. Sight-running or sight-walking are recommended for the athletically inclined. Information and booking at Tourist Information Office.

Tulln open-air markets: All year long, the Hauptplatz is transformed every Friday into the culinary Naschmarkt, which focuses on regional specialty foods. Every first Friday of the month arts and crafts are added to the mix. A farmers' market is held every Saturday.

Top restaurants: Tulln is also well worthwhile for gourmets. Sodoma, Adlerbräu, s'Pfandl and Goldenes Schiff in Tulln have won a number of prestigious awards, as have Der Floh and Das Wolf in nearby Langenlebam. Tulln Tourist Information Office has a full list of all restaurants and eateries in Tulln.

1 Egon Schiele Museum [d1]
Donaulände 28, phone +43 (0)2272/64570. Hours: Apr-Oct, Tue-Sun and holidays 10 a.m.-5 p.m.
At the Egon Schiele Museum Tulln we provide a multimedial insight into Egon Schiele as a private person through selected works and interviews with his family, some contemporaries and experts.

2 Egon Schiele's Birthplace [f2]
Bahnhofstrasse 69, daily 9 a.m.-8 p.m. (Apr-Oct), 9 a.m.-5 p.m. (Nov-Mar)
Admission EUR 2 at the machine
This world famous artist's birthplace has featured a walk-through exhibition since June 2013. The authentically furnished rooms give visitors a sense of how a family might have lived in the late 19th century. A variety of media illuminate the history of the Schiele family. Youngsters will enjoy the special children's tour.

3 Tulln City Museum – Roman Museum & Virtulleum [e1]

The Virtulleum app allows you to explore past epochs by connecting 30 valuable artifacts with 30 places in the city.
The Roman Museum exhibits a host of original finds, pictures, figurines, dioramas and models to show visitors what life may have been like at the Roman cavalry fort Comagenis.

4 Austrian Sugar Museum [d1]
Minoritenplatz 1, phone +43 (0)2272/690-111. Hours: Mon-Wed 8 a.m.-3.30 p.m., Thu 8 a.m.-6 p.m., Fri 8 a.m.-noon
In this, Austria's sweetest museum, visitors can trace the development of sugar production from cane sugar mills to modern sugar factories. It is located in the attic of the Minorite Monastery.

5 Minorite Church [d1]
Minoritenplatz, open during the day year-round
The Minorite Church was completed in 1739 and renovated in 1990. It is among the loveliest Late Baroque churches in Austria. The Loreto Chapel, the sacristy, and the crypt are particularly impressive.

6 St. Stephen's Parish Church [e1/2]
Wiener Strasse 20. Visiting hours: Mon-Fri 8 a.m.-7 p.m., Sat 8 a.m.-8 p.m., Sun 8 a.m.-6 p.m.
The church incorporates a number of styles of architecture with its Ottonian and Romanesque core, a Gothic choir plus Baroque towers and interior. Of particular note is the Romanesque west portal, aka the Apostles' Gate, as well as the marble altar and the magnificent choir stalls.

7 Tulln Charnel House [e1/2]
Tours can be arranged, phone +43 (0)2272/62338-0.
The eleven-sided charnel directly behind St. Stephen's Parish Church is a gem of Late Romanesque architecture and peerless throughout Europe. The magnificent funnel-like portal literally draws visitors into the interior of the church and into ages long past.

8 Roman Tower/Salt Tower [d1]
Donaulände 38
The Roman Tower was the flanking tower of Fort Comagenis and was built about 300 AD. The original Roman walls are preserved up to roof level. As such the tower is one of the few fully preserved structures north of the Alps dating from antiquity. The interior is not open to the public.

9 Hauptplatz [d2]
Hauptplatz, the main square, underwent major renovation in 2009. Among its most striking buildings are the District Commissioner's Office built in Vienna Ringstrasse style in 1891 and a Renaissance building with Venetian crenellations. The square is lined with shops

and outdoor cafés and has a Baroque Trinity Column in the middle of it.

10 Leisure area Donaulände [d1]
Donaulände is the beautifully laid-out and lovingly cared for Danube promenade in the center of Tulln. You can stroll or easily cycle from one sight to the next in a matter of minutes. It features the Nibelung Monument, the Egon Schiele Monument and the Marcus Aurelius Monument. All are the work of the Russian artist Michail Nogin.

11 Regentag, Hundertwasser's Ship [c/d1]
Regentag, the ship of Austrian artist Friedensreich Hundertwasser, lies at anchor in the marina. The artist took this former Sicilian cargo vessel and redesigned it in his own unique style. He lived, painted and traveled on the Regentag for ten years.

12 Donaubühne & Danubium [d1/2]
On balmy summer evenings unforgettable concerts can be experienced in a unique atmosphere at the open-air stage Donaubühne. The Danubium, the event location in Tulln, offers an excellent cabaret and music programme throughout the year.

13 Water Park & Boating [b/c1/2]
The Tulln Water Park is wonderful for strolling and cycling. The intricate web of waterways under the towering riverside trees can also be explored by boat.

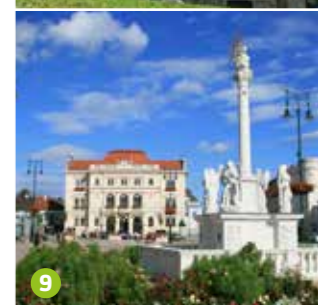
14 GARTEN TULLN [a/b2]
Am Wasserpark 1, phone +43 (0)2272/68188. Hours: daily Apr-Oct 9 a.m.-6 p.m.
GARTEN TULLN is the main attraction in town for gardening enthusiasts. The 70 extravagant show gardens are well worth seeing and experiencing as are the treetop trail, the playground and a wealth of special events.

15 Messe Tulln [b2]
Messe Tulln has put on about ten trade fairs of international calibre a year for more than 60 years. Among the highlights on the fair calendar are trade fairs on horticulture, boats and dogs. The facilities are also very popular for seminars and conferences.

16 Aubad Recreational Park [g1]
With its water slides and sand beach, Aubad is just the place to go for swimming fun and excitement. The recreational park is an oasis for sun worshipers and recreational athletes alike.

17 Recreational Park & Minigolf [e1]
There is such a broad choice of activities right on Donaulände between the indoor pool, ice-skating rink and Aubad: Skaters' court, BMX, minigolf, a driver's practice course, and plenty of room for children and young people to romp to their hearts' content.

18 DonauSplash [e1]
This sports and family swimming facility leaves nothing to be desired. The wellness area is an ideal place to relax after swimming a few lengths in the big sports pool. Children enjoy splashing around in the warm water and have incredible fun going down the fast, two-story high slide.
